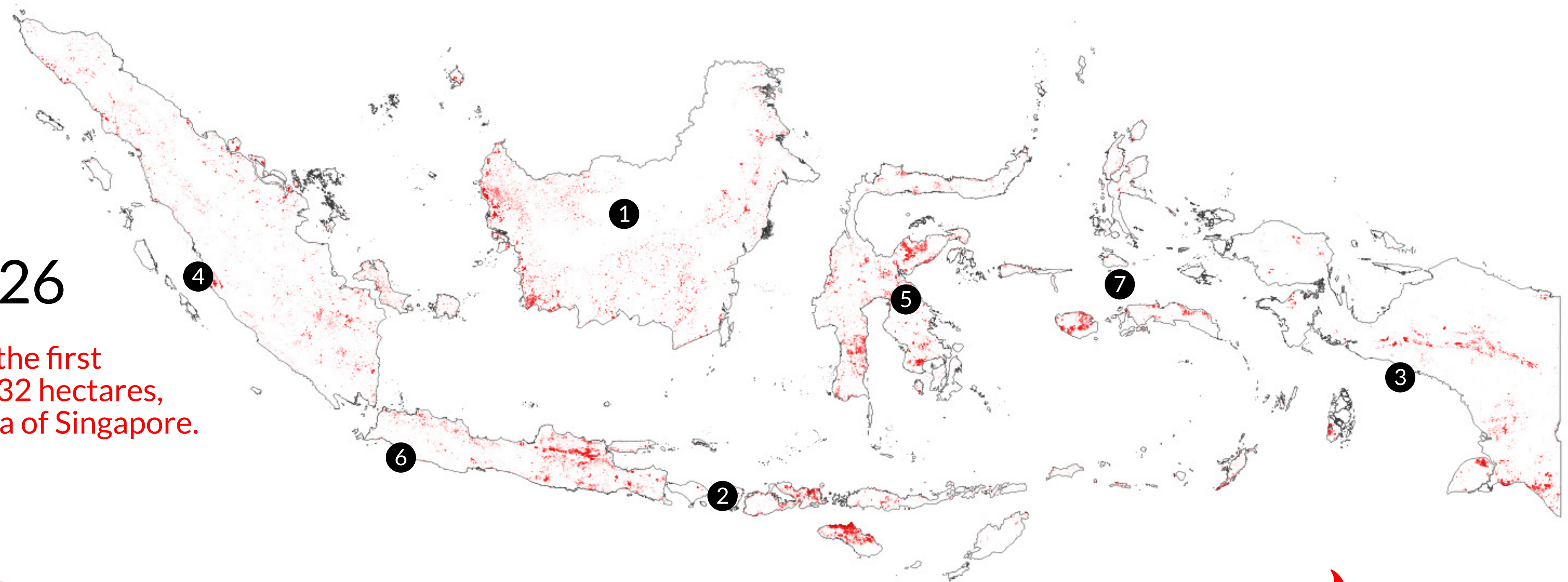

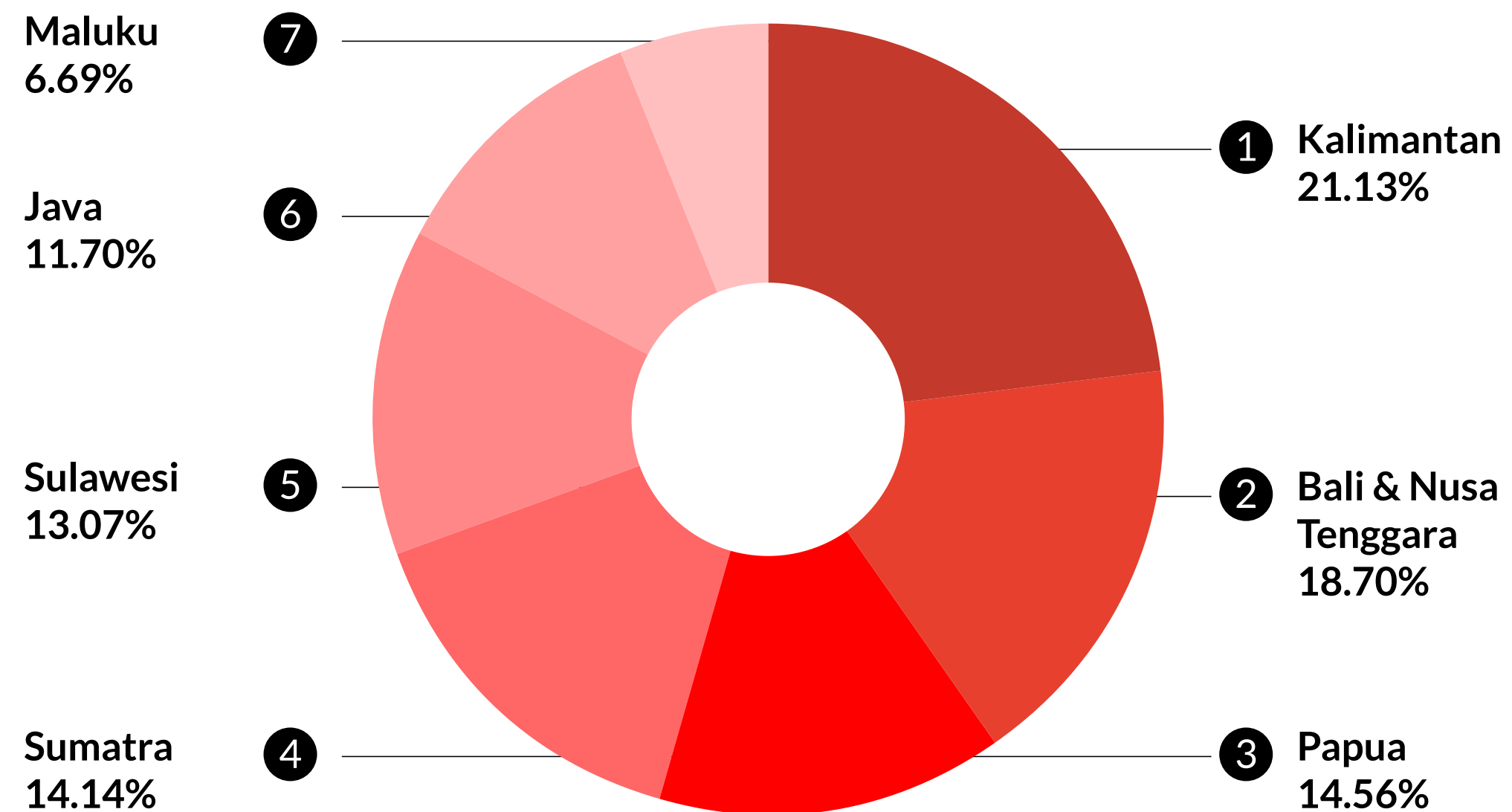


Burned Area in Indonesia January–June 2026

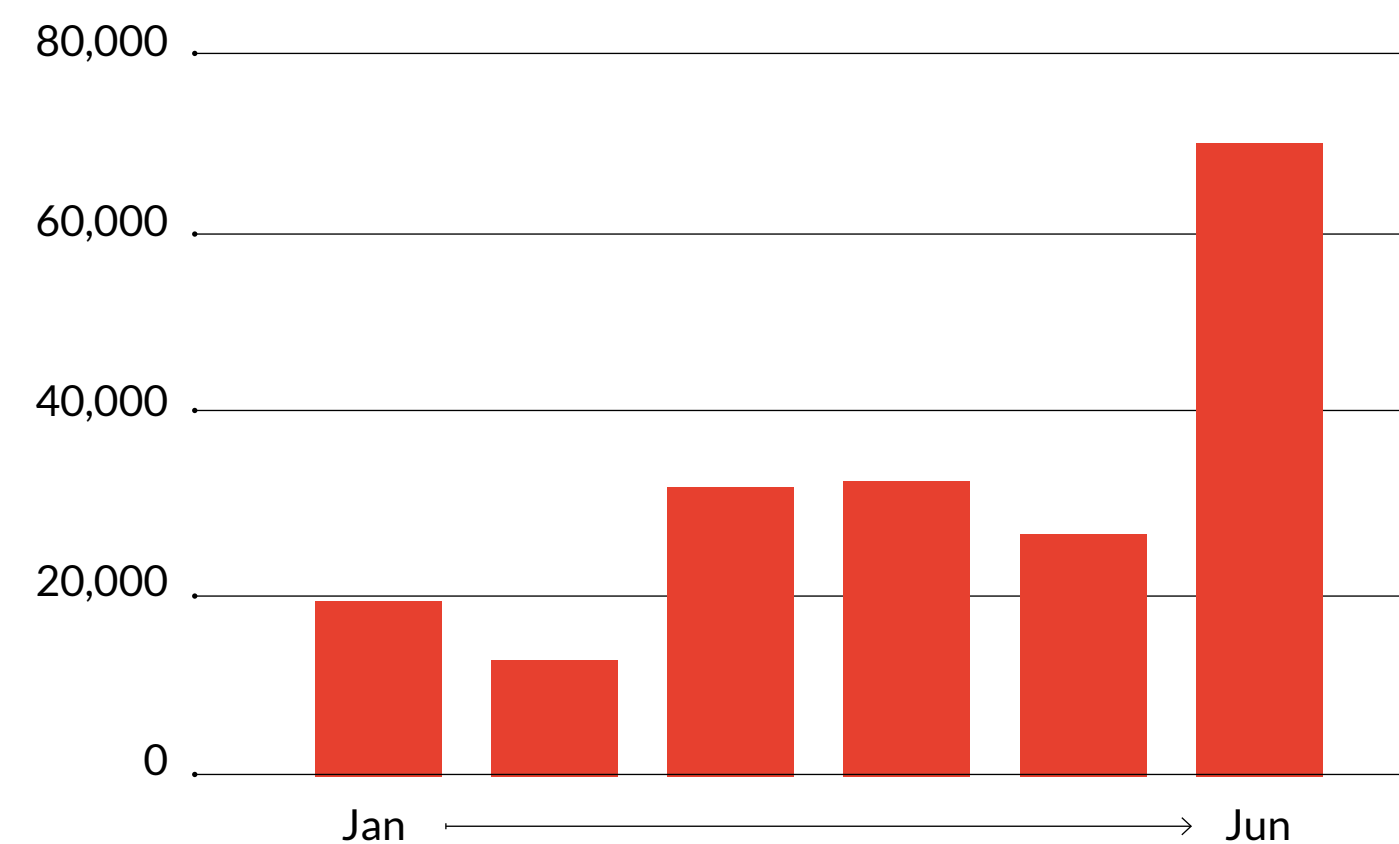
Burned area in Indonesia during the first semester of 2026 reached 178,232 hectares, equivalent to three times the area of Singapore.

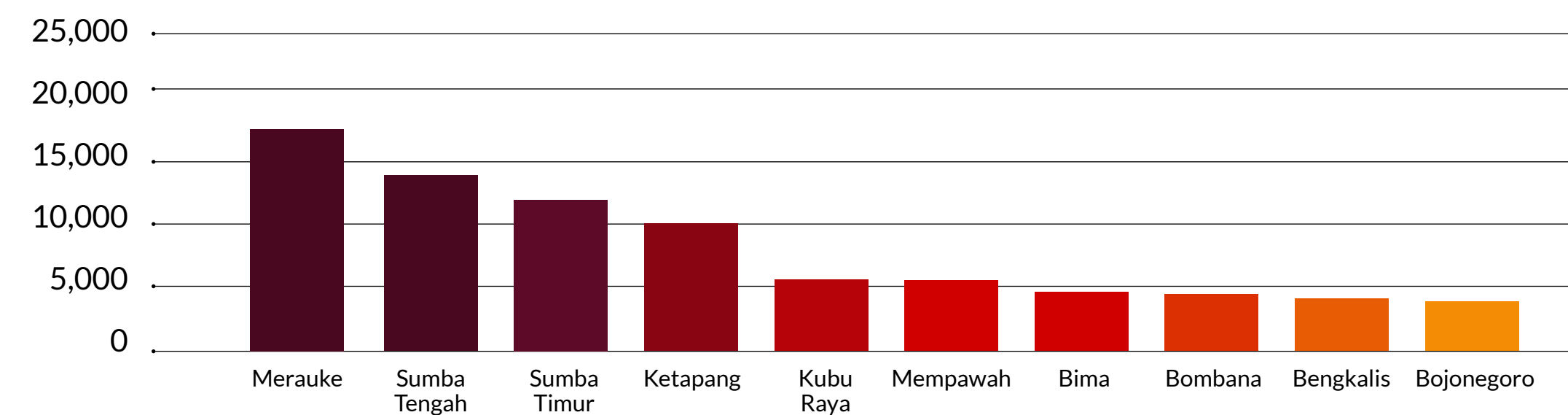
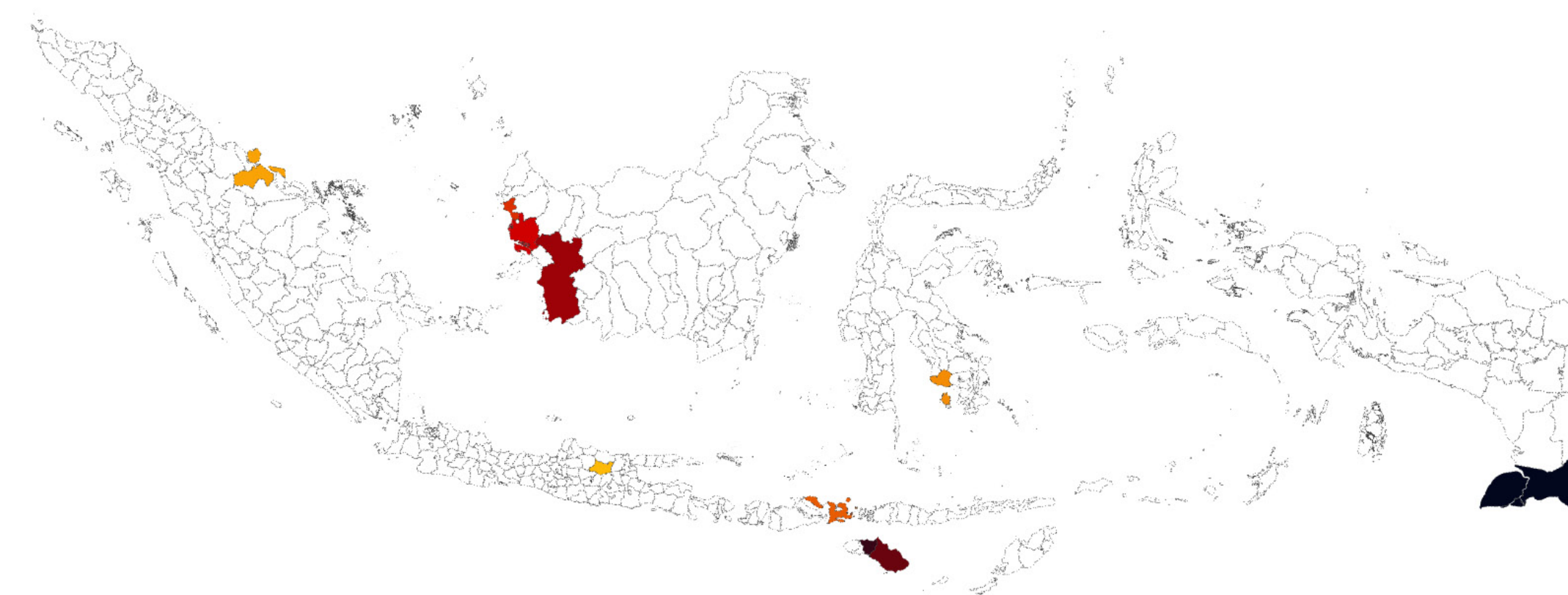
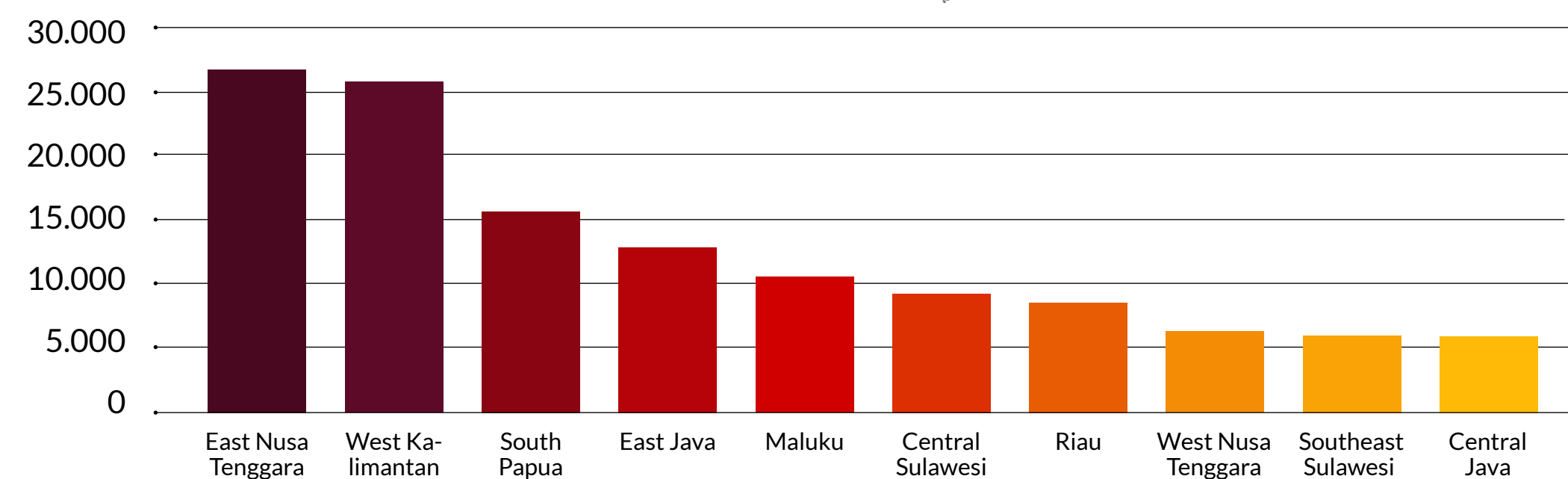
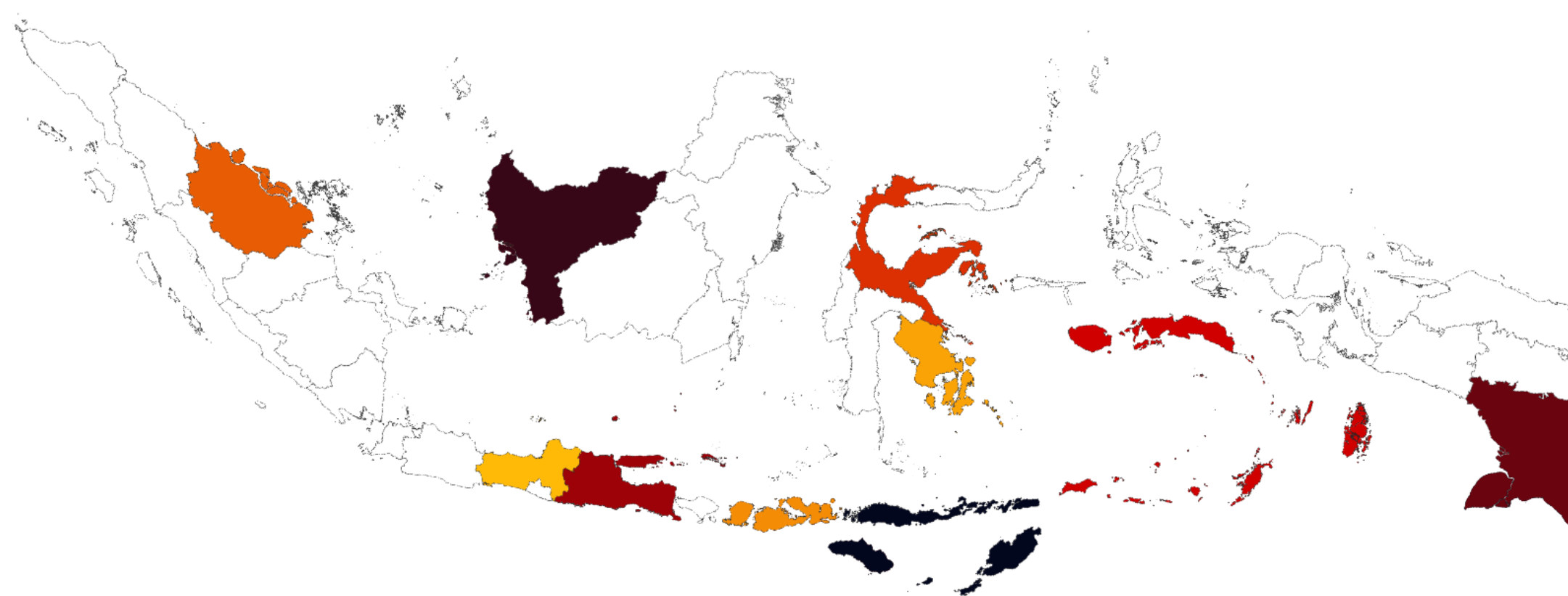

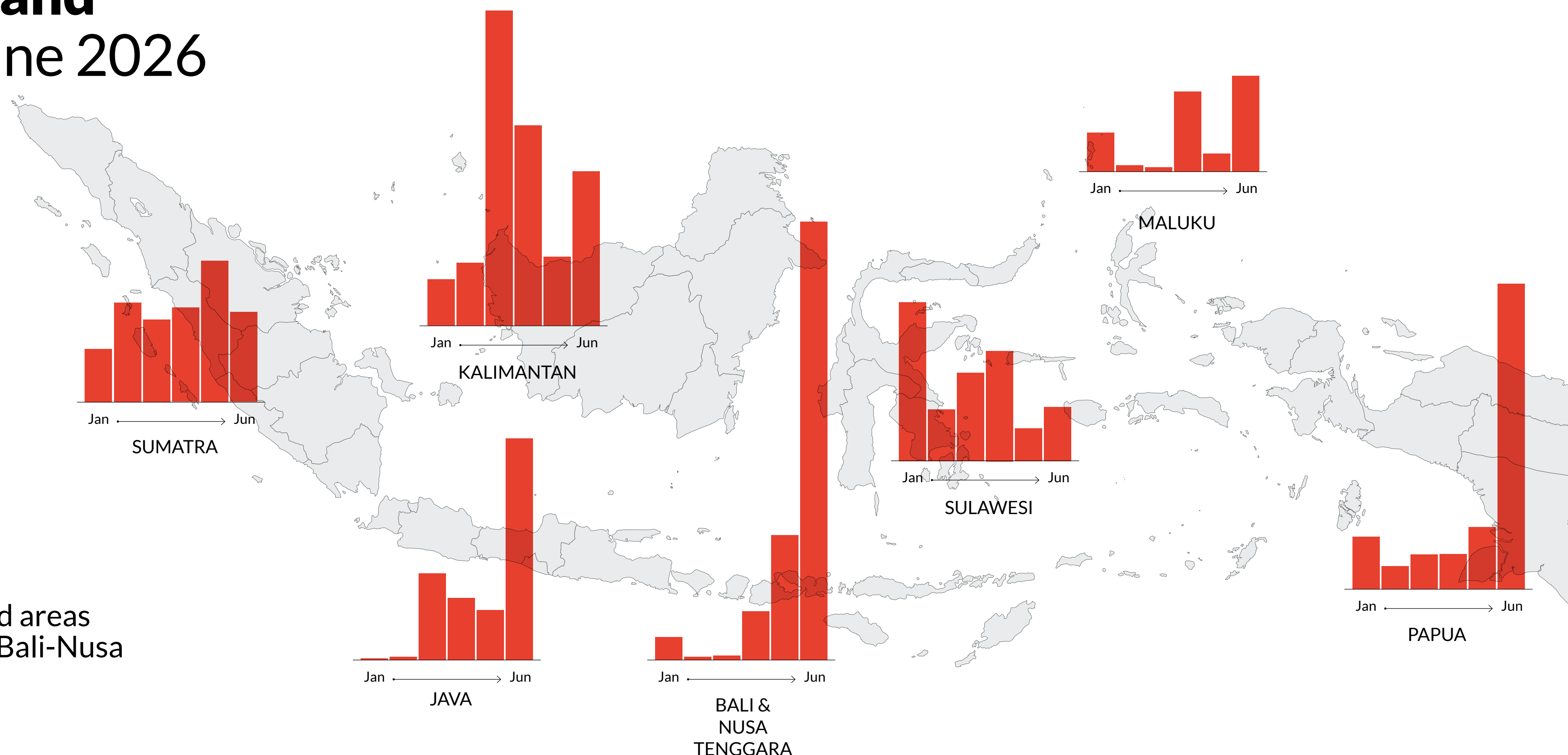

In June 2026, burned area rose significantly in Java, Bali and Nusa Tenggara, and Papua

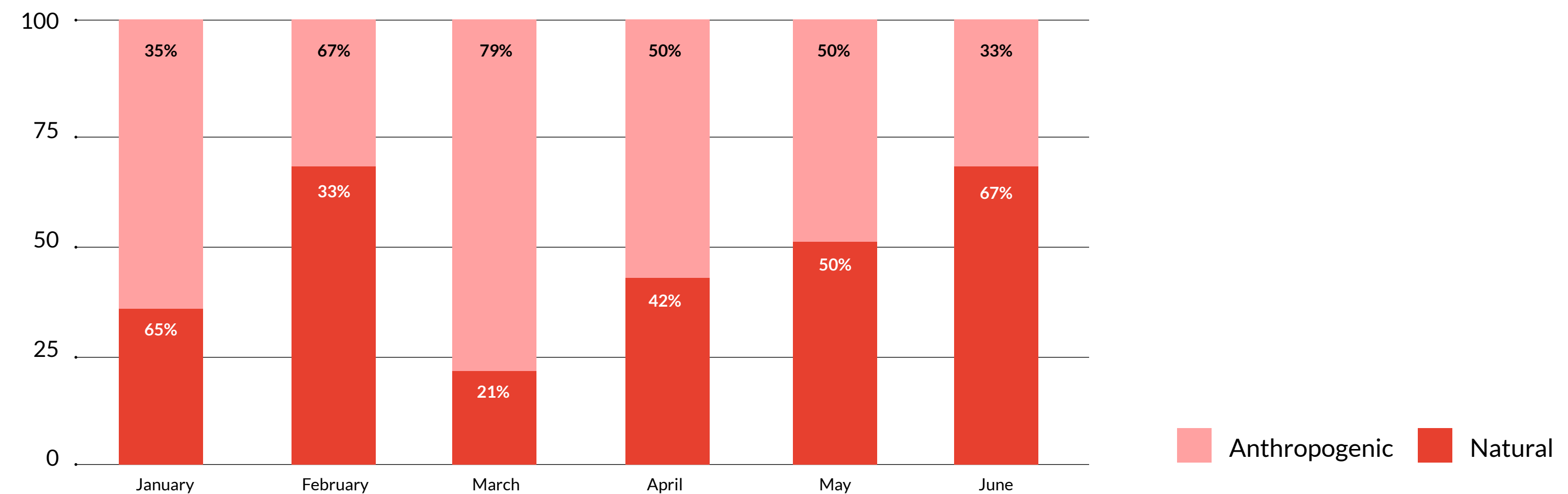
50% of burned areas were in Kalimantan, Bali-Nusa Tenggara, and Papua

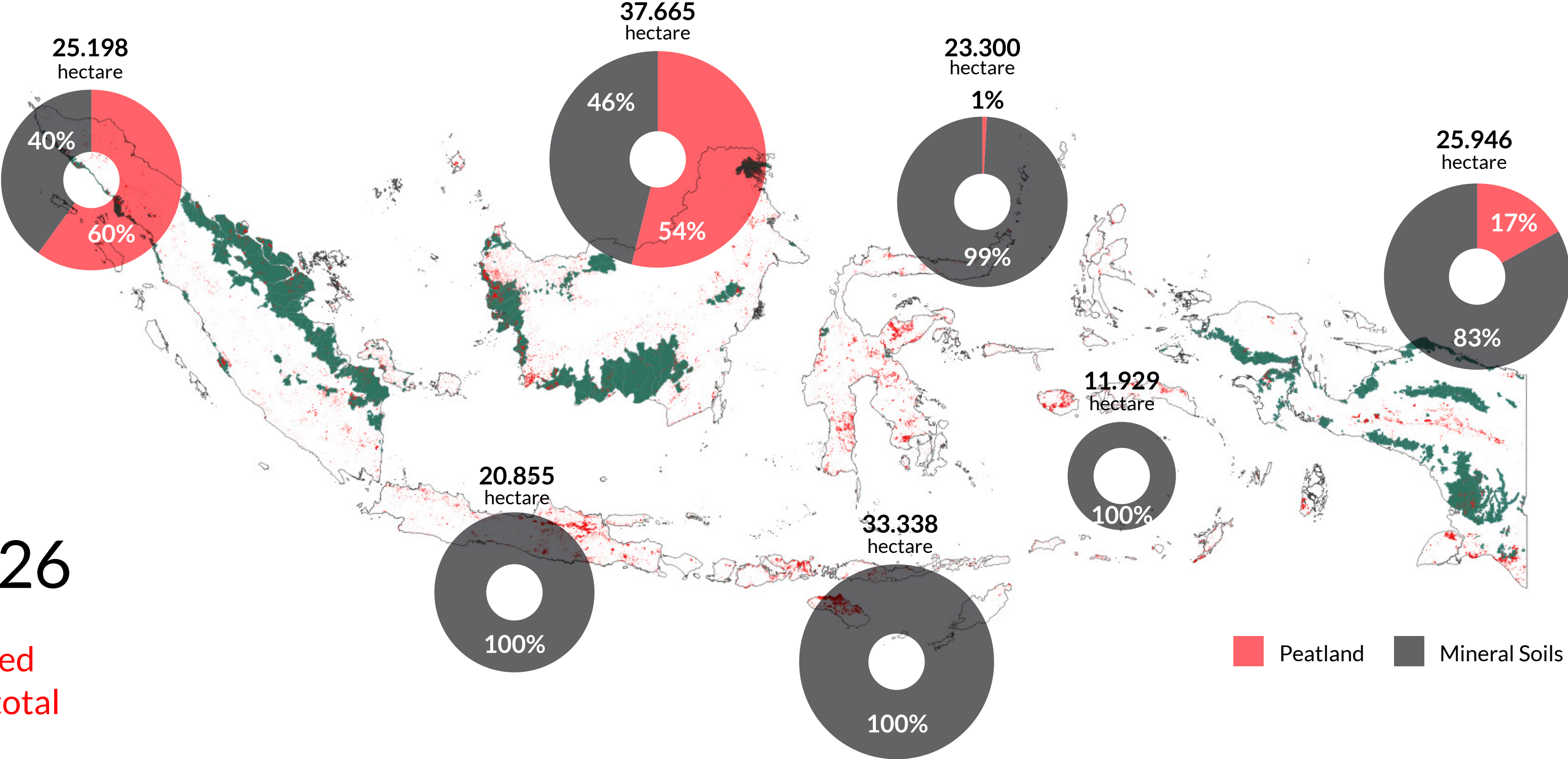


Burned Area On Peatlands and Lands With Mineral Soils January-June 2026

Burned area on peatlands covered 40,016 hectares, or 22% of the total national burned area.

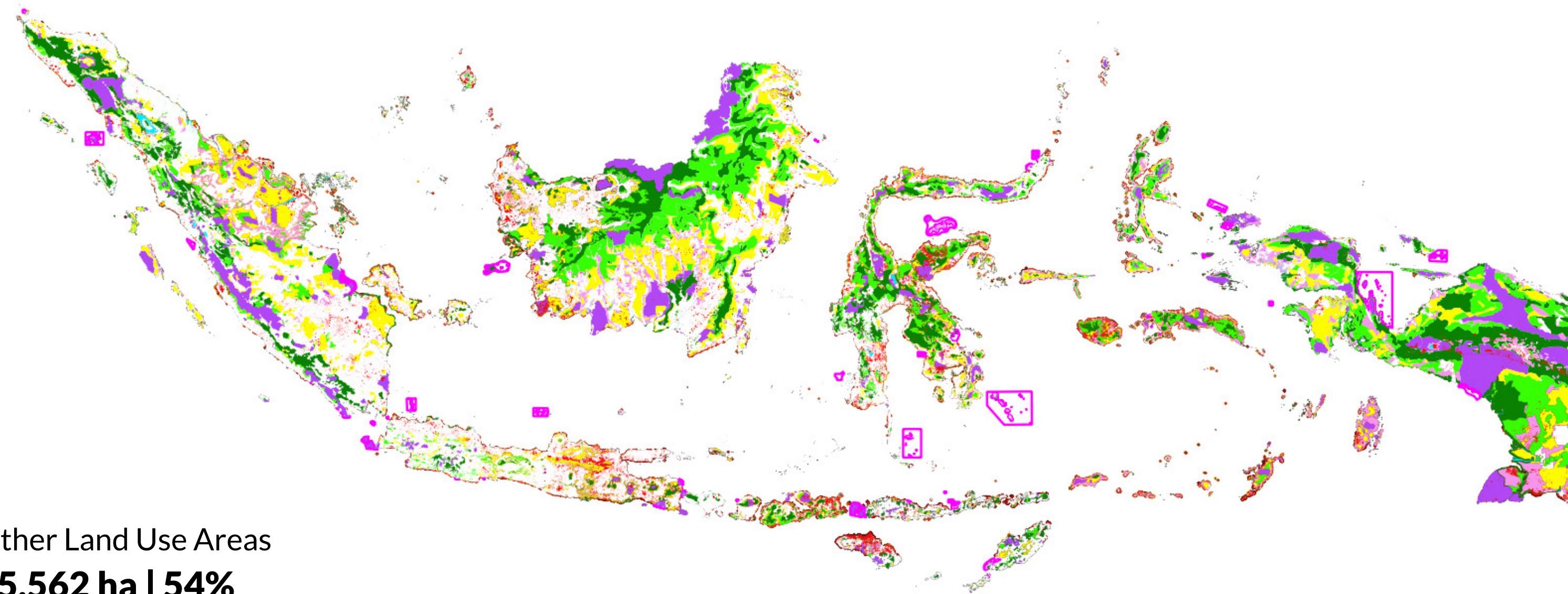
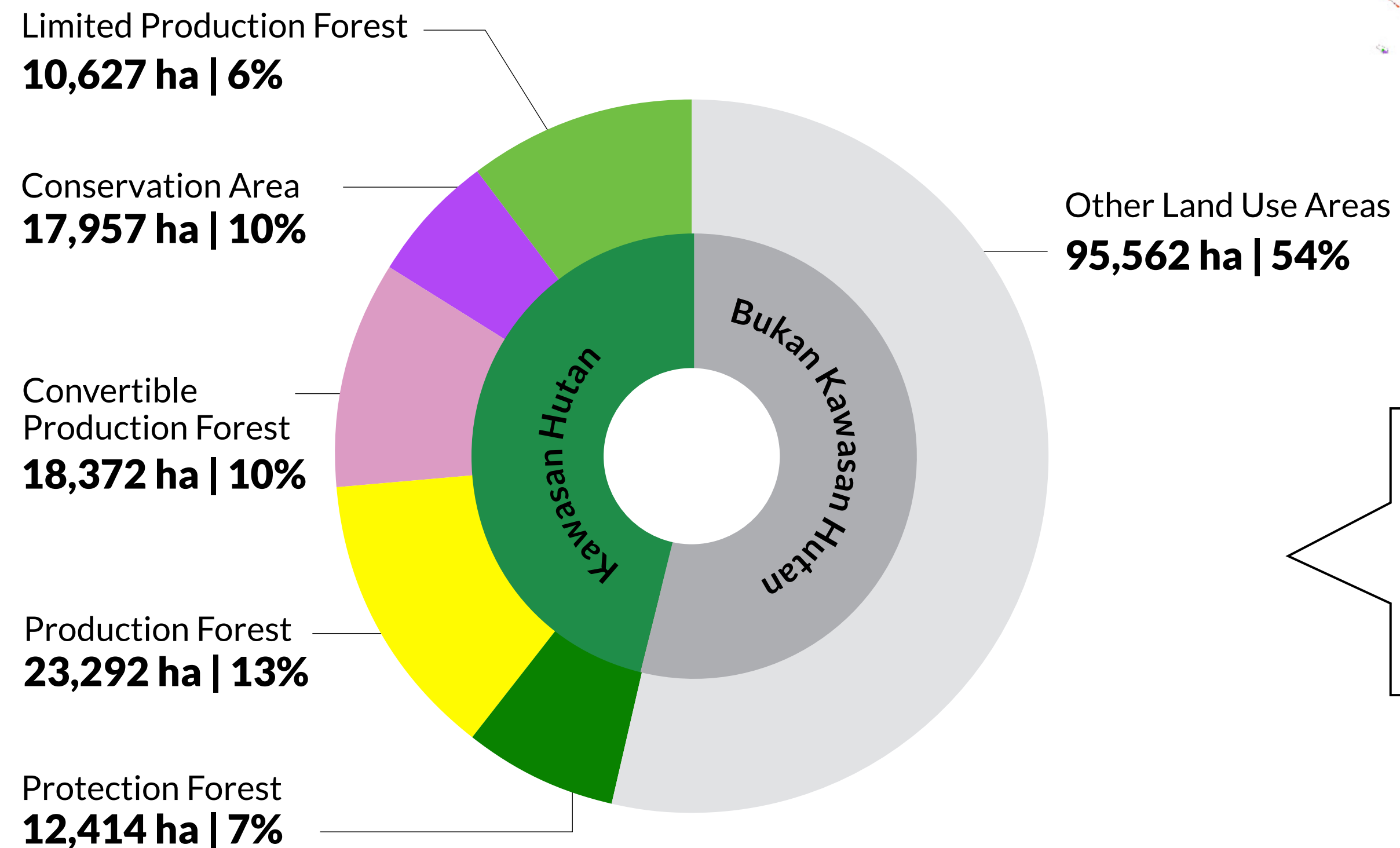
Nearly 90% of burned peatland area was in Kalimantan (51%) and Sumatra (38%).

Burned area in Java, Bali and Nusa Tenggara, and Maluku covered 66,123 hectares, or 37% of the national burned area, but all occurred on lands with mineral soils.

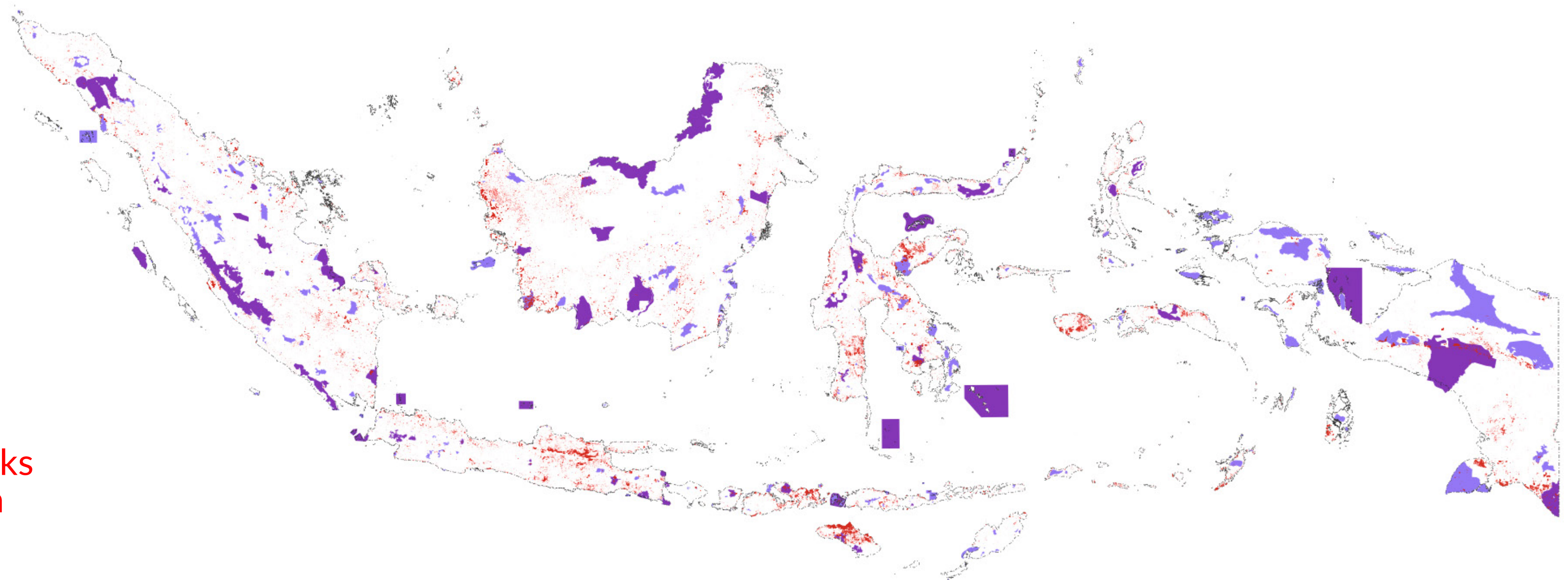
Burned Area Inside the Forest Estate January-June 2026



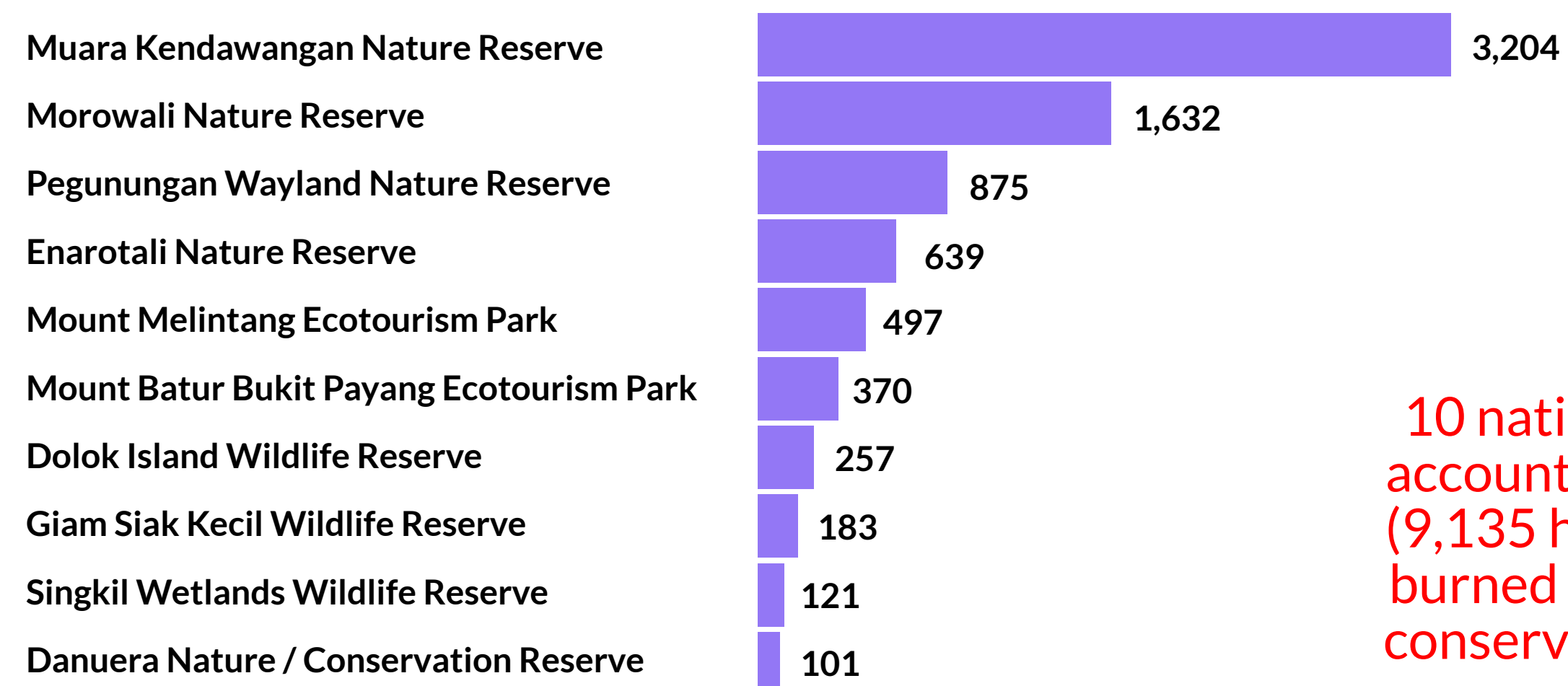

179 conservation areas (39 national parks and 140 non-national park conservation areas) had burned areas.

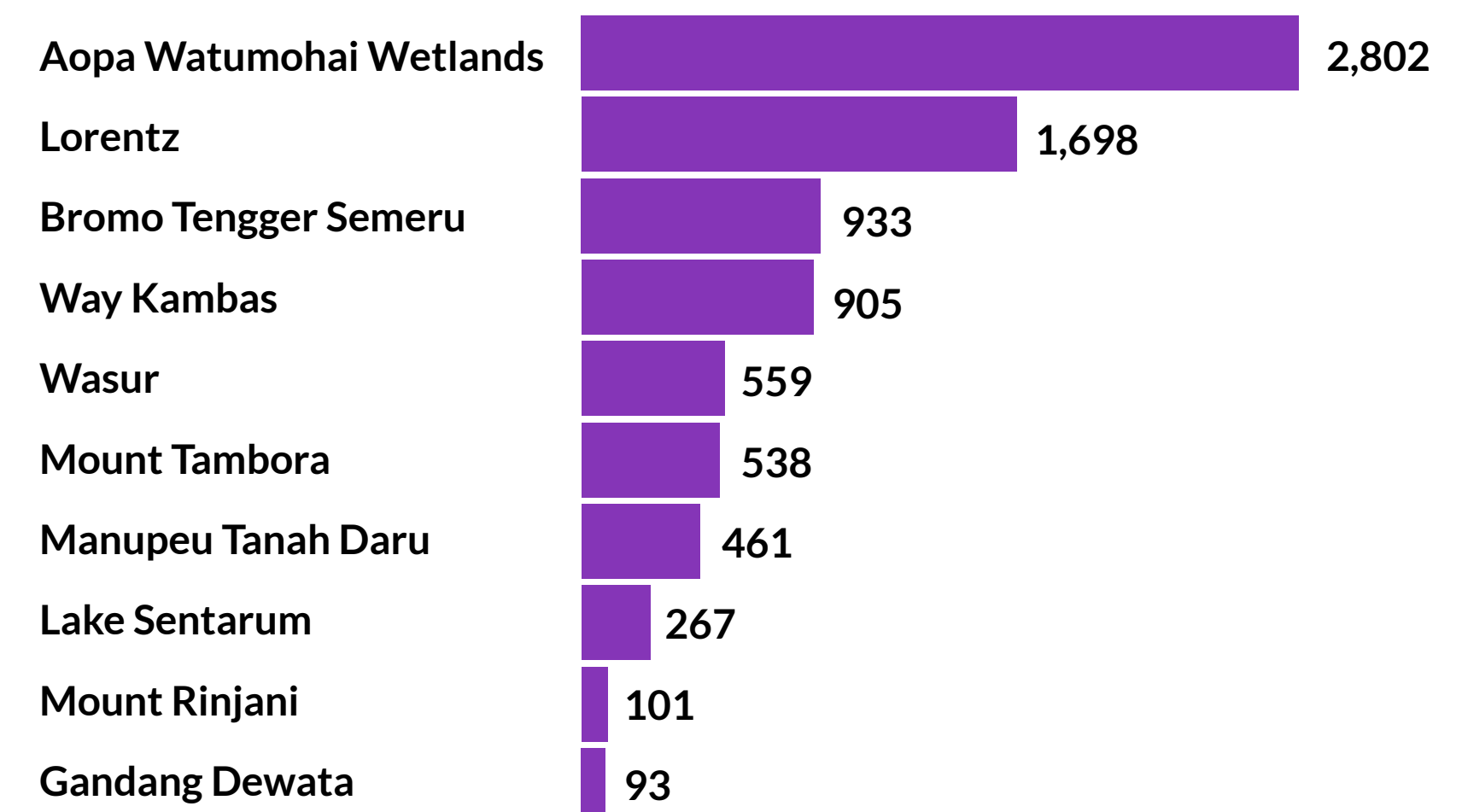


Top 10 Non-National Park Conservation Areas (hectares)

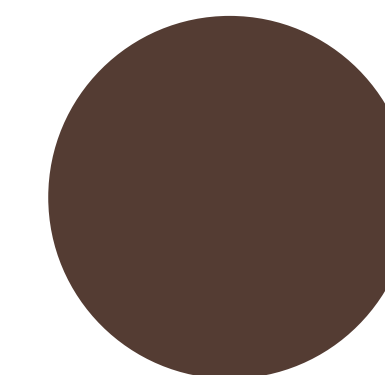

Burned Area Inside Iconic Species Habitats January-June 2026

Habitats of iconic species (tigers, rhinos, elephants, orangutans) were also affected by fires. A total of 11,442 hectares of burned area occurred within the habitats of these four species.

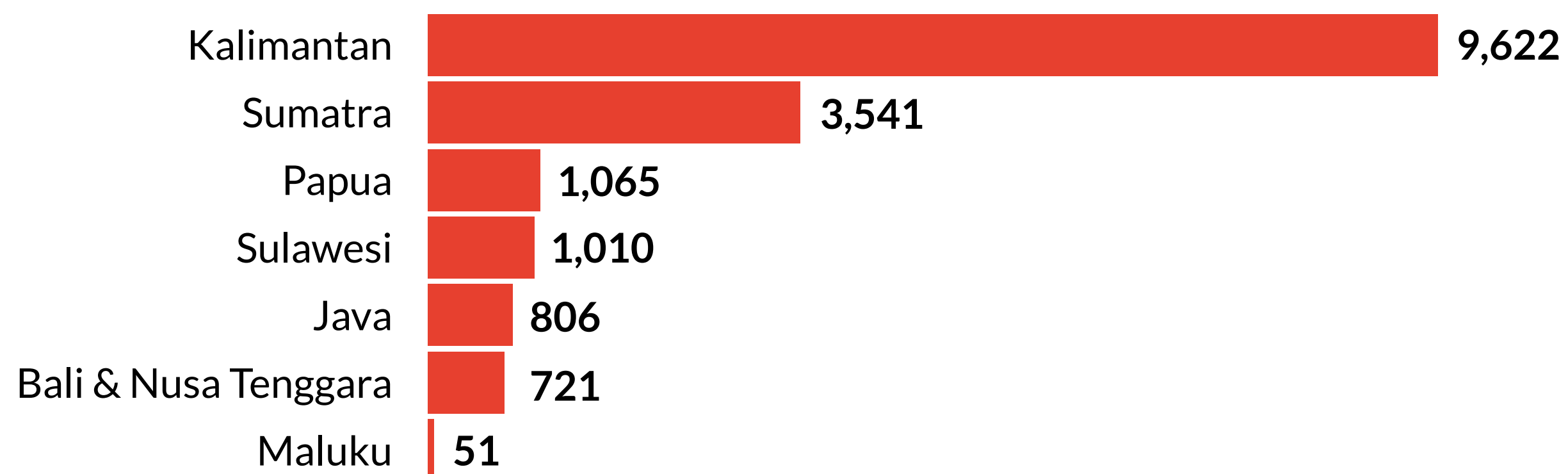

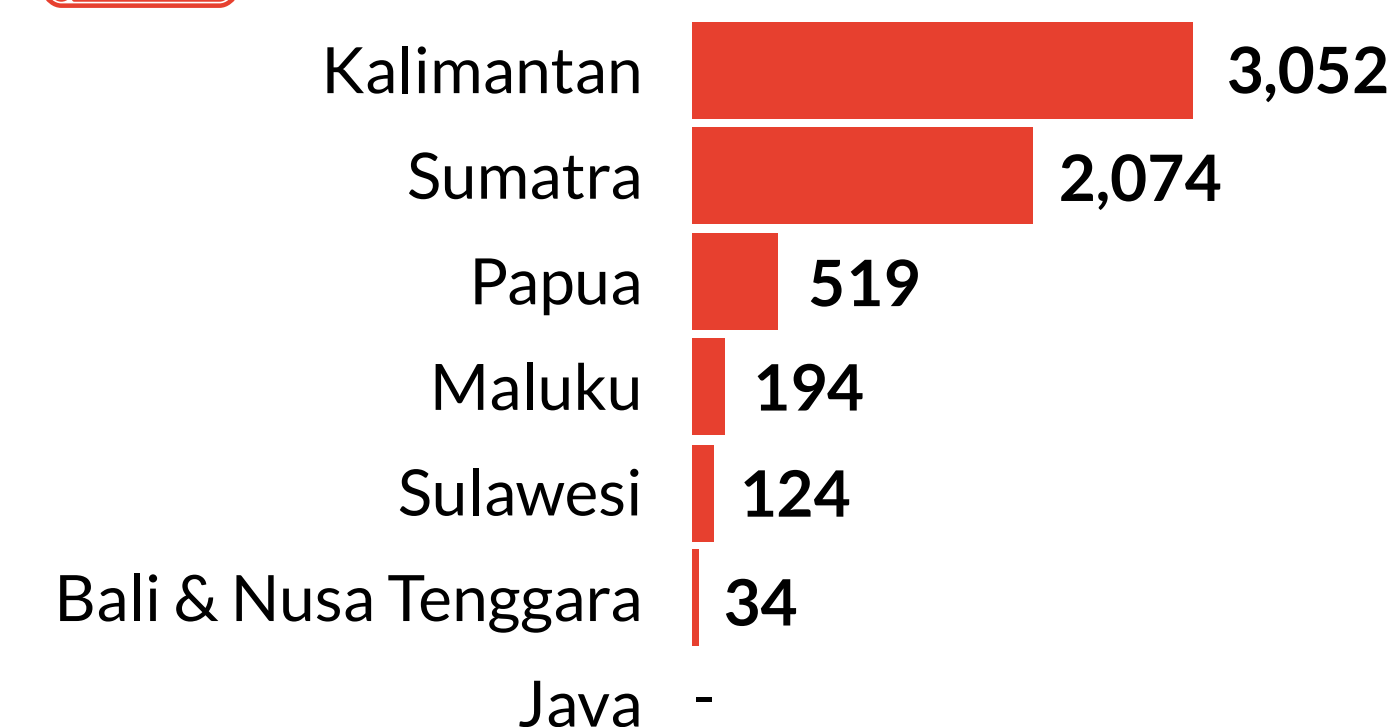

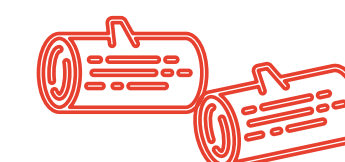
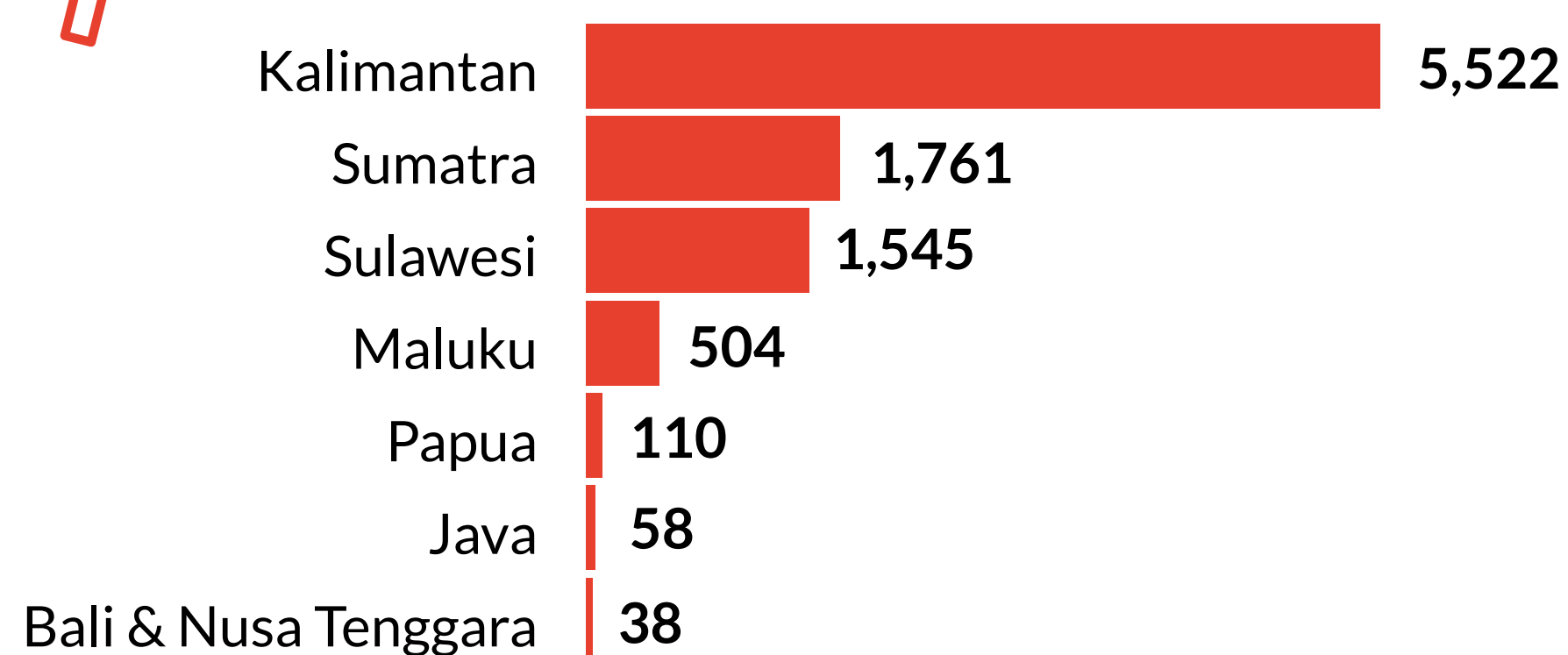
Oil Palm Plantations (hectares)



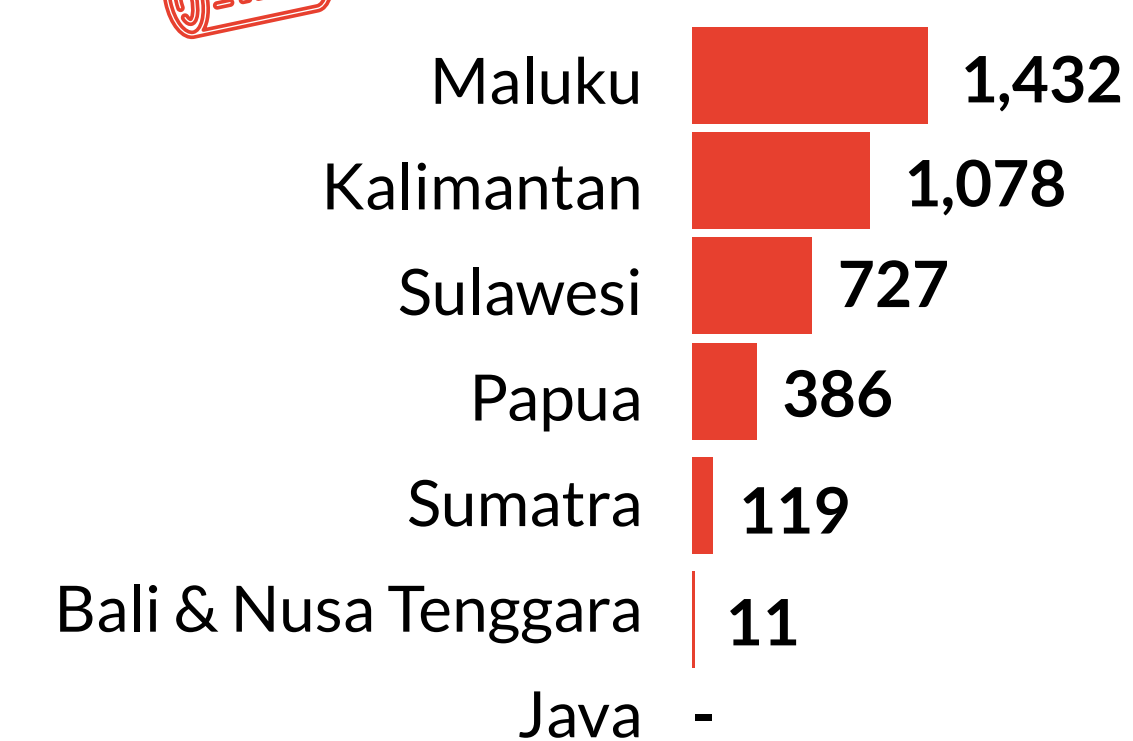
Timber Plantations (hectares)

Burned Area On Deforested Land January-June 2026

25,053 hectares of burned area were in areas that had experienced deforestation between 2001 and 2025, with 4,508 hectares (18%) deforested from 2020–2025.

21,965 hectares (88%) of this deforested area was in Kalimantan and Sumatra.

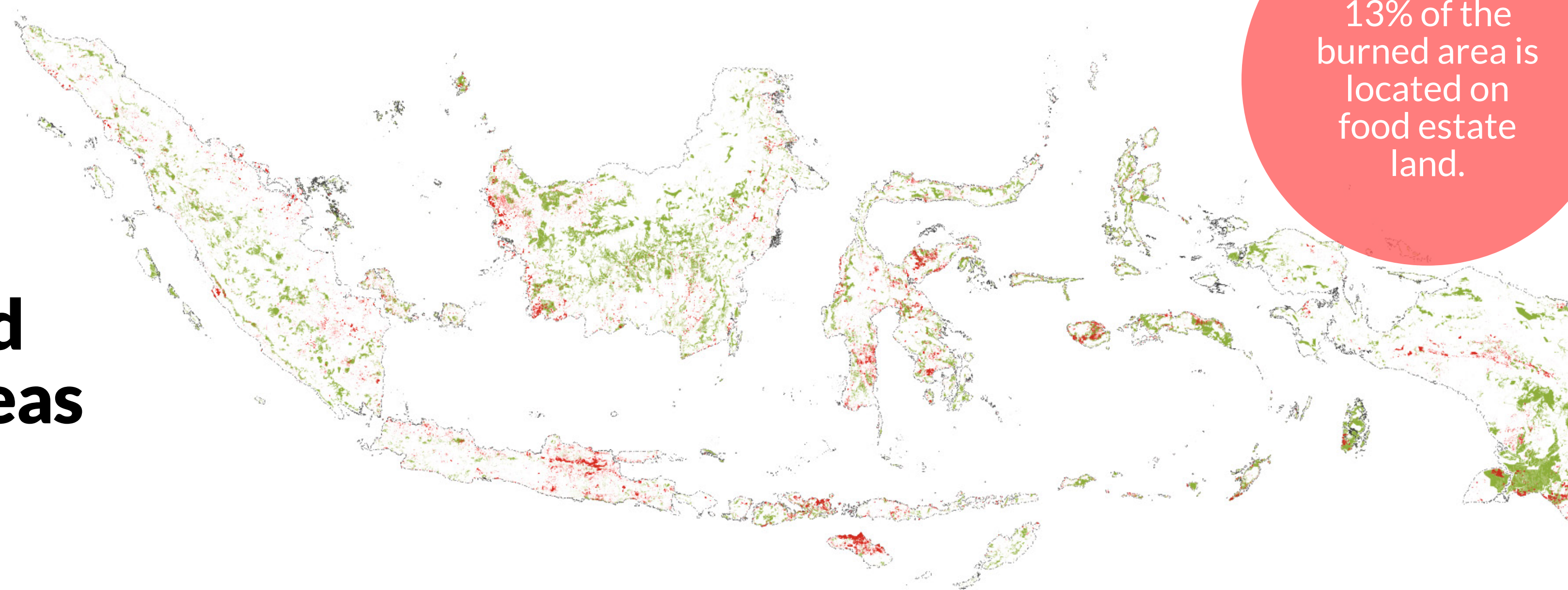

Burned Area In Food Security Project Areas January-June 2026

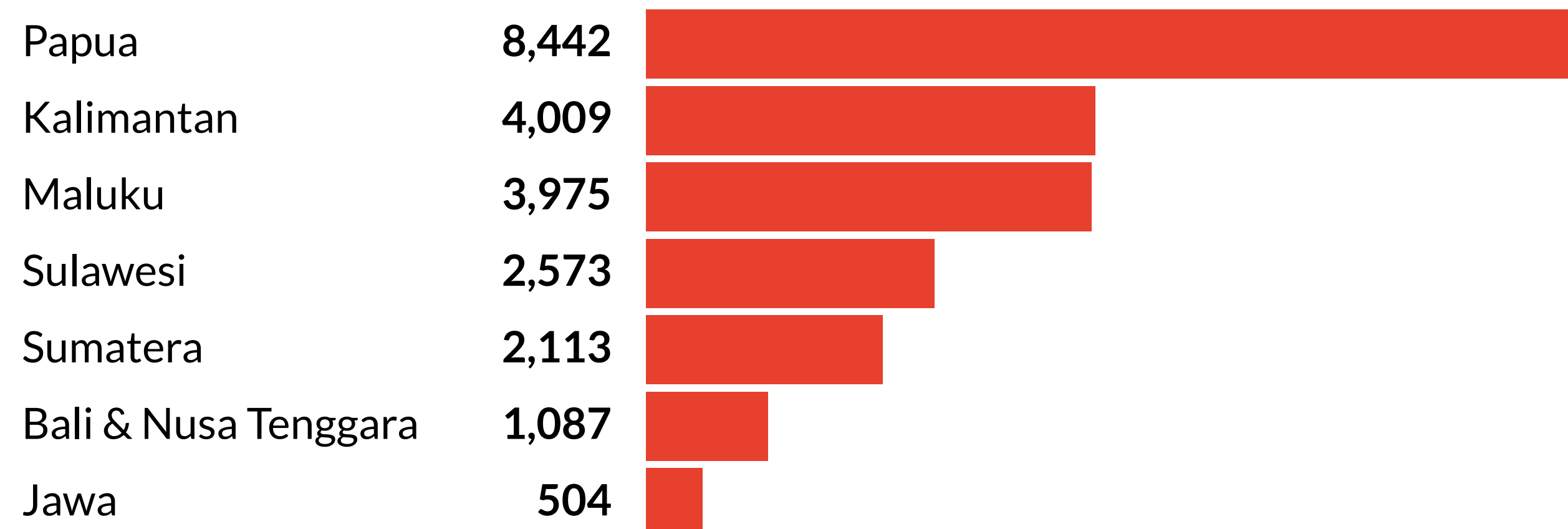
22,703 hectares of burned area was on land for food security project areas (food estates, forest estate for food reserves, and the community rice field programme).

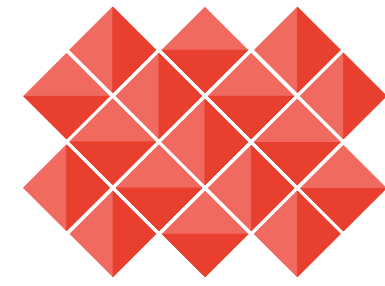
Merauke Regency had the largest burned area, at 8,084 hectares, or 36% of the total burned area on food project land.
